OUTBACK

This Immersion is a chance to step out of your everyday routine and experience life in remote parts of Australia, learning from the people who live there and seeing things from a new perspective. Over nine days, you will take part in a journey that includes preparation, hands-on experiences and time to reflect. You will meet inspiring individuals, hear powerful stories and gain a deeper understanding of Aboriginal culture and outback life. The aim is to spend time 'being with' local people in their daily lives, listening and learning.

Catholic Mission has spent years building strong partnerships with communities across Australia. This immersion gives CBC students a chance to step into those communities, learn from local people and gain a new perspective on life in the Outback. The program is carefully planned with each hosting community and focuses on building real connections. It is not outback tourism, it is a meaningful, educational experience based on Catholic values.

We begin by heading north to the Flinders Ranges, stopping at Quorn to climb Devil's Peak and explore the historical township. We stay overnight at Pichi Richi, a bush retreat, and enjoy the silo light show after dinner. The next day takes us through Hawker for a visit to the Jeff Morgan Gallery, morning Mass with local families, then on to Wilpena Pound, Blinman and Parachilna Gorge before arriving at Iga Warta. Here, we take part in a welcome and cultural activities.

Next, we travel across the bottom of Lake Eyre to William Creek and then to Coober Pedy, where we stay for four days. Our hosts are the Umoona Tjutagku Aboriginal community, who welcome us into their programs and activities. Highlights include sleeping underground, visiting the underground Catholic Church, learning about opals and the town's unique history, and even trying some fossicking ourselves. Our final night in Coober Pedy is spent watching the sun set over the Breakaways in Kanku Reserve, immersed in the unique moonscape beauty.

On our way home, we stop at Woomera to explore the Aerospace Museum and learn about the history of First Nations displacement in the region. Our final night is spent at Spear Creek, where we have time to rest, reflect and share what we have learned.

Please note the itinerary may change, depending on the needs of the communities we visit.
